## **Ongoing Staff Commitments of Significance**

City Council was made aware of the ongoing staff commitments of significance: 131<sup>st</sup> Maine Legislative Session, Comprehensive Plan Update, Implementation of Economic Development Strategy, Implications and Implementation of LD2003, Climate Action Plan, City workforce development and retention, capital projects, housing inventory, document management system, website update, and update to Economic Development Strategy.

Since our initial meeting, City staff have also become involved in the Department of Housing and Urban Development's Technical Assistance (TA) process. The TA process is an emergency management type approach that is wholly focused on identifying the barriers and identifying solutions to rapidly house individuals. This work requires a significant time commitment not only from the City but from the various agencies who support our unhoused individuals through March of 2023.

Lastly, a number of City staff will be committed to the training and rollout of the new Community Action Teach (BCAT) and outreach worker during the month of January As means to track our progress throughout the year, a table was created that identifies the priorities and commitments that will be incorporated into our existing work over the next quarter as the associated staff resources. By focusing on the first quarter of the year, this will allow us to reassess priorities and assess progress at regular intervals.
