EMERGENCY REGULATION: REPEAL OF PRIOR EMERGENCY REGULATION GOVERNING BUSINESS LICENSES

WHEREAS, there is an ongoing pandemic caused by the 2019 novel coronavirus ("COVID-19");

WHEREAS, the City issued a Proclamation Declaring State of Emergency on March 16, 2020, in response to the COVID-19 outbreak;

WHEREAS, said outbreak continues to emerge and spread rapidly, so that the number of cases of COVID-19 since the City's Proclamation was issued has risen from eight confirmed cases and nine presumptive positive cases to 4,941 cases, 496 of which are active cases;

WHEREAS, health officials have now confirmed 252 cases of COVID-19 in Penobscot County, 16 of which are active cases; and

WHEREAS, the City issued ER# 6, Emergency Regulation: Business Licenses on March 30, 2020 when City Hall was closed to the general public; and

WHEREAS, the COVID-19 pandemic continues but that the City has opened its offices and services to the extent safely possible; and

I, Catherine M. Conlow, City Manager of the City of Bangor, pursuant to the City's Proclamation Declaring State of Emergency of March 16, 2020 and Section 28-79 of the Bangor City Code, regulate as follows, effective as of October 2, 2020 at 12:01 A.M.:

1. ER# 6, Emergency Regulation: Business Licenses is hereby repealed and shall no longer have any force or effect.
2. The effect of this ER #15, Emergency Regulation: Repeal of Prior Emergency Regulation Governing Business Licenses is to require businesses within the City of Bangor to comply with the City of Bangor's licensing requirements by October 2, 2020, which licensing requirements had previously been suspended.
